tasks to clear the Songbird Trail and the tower trails near Lake Conasauga, a beautiful area located near the Cohutta Wilderness. There is plenty of parking, and the lot is easy to access. Please meet CDTV at the Lake Conasauga Overflow Parking Lot at 9:00 am on June 4, 2022. Plan on 3 to 5 miles of easy-to-moderate hiking. If you have a hand saw, please bring that with you. LET'S USE THE DISCUSSION BOARD ON MEETUP TO COMMUNICATE WHO IS BRINGING WHAT.

What to Bring:

Bring work gloves, a safety whistle (at least one for you/your group), your hard hat (if you have one), enough food and water for the day, and a backpack to carry your supplies/food. Sturdy boots and appropriate clothing layers are required for the task at hand (long pants are required; we also recommend long-sleeve shirts for this workday, as well). SHOES FOR WET-FOOTED RIVER CROSSINGS ARE RECOMMENDED. Tools and safety gear such as hard hats and protective eyewear will be provided. If you plan to stay for the food and fellowship after the work is complete, please bring a dish to share and place settings for yourself and your party members.

Directions to the Lake Conasauga Overflow Parking Lot:

- From downtown Ellijay, GA, travel on GA 372 north approximately 5 miles to a right turn on Gates Chapel Road.
- Stay on Gates Chapel Road approximately 5.3 miles and take a slight right on Wilderness Road. (gravel road)
- Stay on Wilderness Road approximately 1.6 miles and make hard right turn onto Conasauga Road/Old CCC Camp Road.
- Travel approximately 3.2 winding miles to a T-intersection, and turn left on Conasauga Road/Conasauga Lake Road.
- You will pass the intersection with Tearbritches Trailhead on right and the camping field on the left, then stay straight at the intersection with West Cowpen Road that extends to the right.
- The overflow campground will be approximately 5.2 miles total from the T-intersection where you turned left
